Subject: Pestmaster Services donates large scale Bed Bug treatment to Washington Manor

Paul Alley, President of Pestmaster Services of NY is pleased to announce that Pestmaster Services has teamed up Allergy Technologies LLC from Ambler, PA at the Washington Manor Homeless shelter on Washington Ave in the City of Kingston. Pestmaster Services was pleased to donate our pest control services to aid the Washington Manor in its mission to house and feed the needy without having to worry about the additional expenses of pest control. Paul Alley President and Adam Stafford, service manager for Pestmaster Services of NY recently identified a bed bug infestation @ the Washington Manor Shelter. We knew immediately that we would be the only ones that could tackle such a large issue in a short time frame. Allergy Technologies defrayed the costs of chemicals, donated their *Active Guard mattress covers* and arranged for entomologist Jim Ballard to offer technical support on site. By also reaching out to our vendors such as Residex, BASF, and our generous friends @ Allways Movers and Herzog's along with our fellow Pestmaster Services branch in NJ and Pest-Shield Inc. of Suffern NY, Numerous teams of technicians and Sophie the bed bug dog, were able to make short work of an otherwise large task. We were able to complete a full bed bug treatment on this 50 bed facility this past Saturday. Allergy technologies donated mattress covers and supplied entomologist Jim Ballard for technical support. Herzogs donated coveralls and disposable gloves, Allways Movers donated a truck for temporary storage of the resident's belongings.

Diane Reeder, of the Queens Galley said "The Washington Manor shelter is funded by donations and support of the community residents and businesses such as Pestmaster Services. We are not government funded which allows us to feed or house anyone who seeks a meal or a warm bed without having to provide proof of poverty. We believe that anyone who is humble enough to walk into a shelter/soup kitchen should be given a meal and not asked for a tax return to prove need. This approach has enabled us to continue our mission to connect working families struggling with food insecurity with resources they need to maintain housing, medical and childcare payments. In 2009 we served over 101,000 meals.
